BART Police 1017 Internal Affairs 2017

This report contains statistical data compiled by the BART Police Office of Internal Affairs, addressing the number and nature of misconduct allegations resulting from Citizen Complaints and Administrative Investigations. Additionally, report enumerates use of force statistics.

Annual Report

Internal Affairs Overview

The BART Police Office of Internal Affairs received 112 complaints from citizens with regards to police conduct during 2017.

- Of the 112 complaints, 75 were reported and investigated as Formal Citizen Complaints.
- The remaining 29 complaints were reported as Informal Citizen Complaints and were addressed through Supervisory Referrals.

There were 8 Administrative Investigations initiated by the Office of Internal Affairs.



Each incident is categorized by a primary allegation which is considered to be the most serious and/or significant allegation made against the officer. Sustained allegations are considered to be the primary allegation over non-sustained allegations.

The following data quantifies the primary allegations from citizens in 2017:







Citizen Demographics for Formal and Informal Complaints:





Use of Force



There was a total of 314 reportable use of force incidents (as defined in Policy 300) in 2017. This compares to 67,018 total calls for service/incidents, meaning that officers used force in fewer than 0.469% of all calls for service/incidents during the year. There were 314 incidents where force was used; however, some incidents involved the use of multiple force types.
