

California Constitution, Article XXI, Section 2(e)



California FAIR MAPS Act – AB 849

- Board resolution, January 2022, "...that BART's redistricting strategy greatly aligns with the requirements set forth in the FAIR MAPS Act..."
- Section 21500 of the Elections Code, Item (d)
- Districts shall not be adopted for the purpose of favoring or discriminating against a political party





PUC: BART Redistricting

- Public Utilities Code, Division 10 Transit Districts; Part 2: San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit; Chapter 3: Government of District, Article 2.2
- Boundaries of the election districts need not conform to the boundaries of counties, cities, cities and counties, or districts, or of wards, or election districts established for the nomination or election of any officers thereof, or of Assembly, Senate, or Congressional Districts
- GEOinovo has made every effort to maintain geographic integrity of cities and places

Plan E and E2: Director Input

- Identical or nearly identical: District 1, 2, 3, and 6
- Differences: 4, 5, 7, 8 and 9

• Population variance: E: 0.07%, E2: 0.09%









Plan E2: District 1, 2, 3

- District 1: Clayton, Moraga, Lafayette, Orinda,
 Morgan Territory Rd; 4 BART stations (incl.
 Concord Station) + 1 shared
- District 2: Five (5) BART stations + northern half of Martinez
- District 3: Improved geographic compactness; Five
 (5) BART stations + 2 shared stations, NW Contra
 Costa County cities, Albany, Berkeley





Plan E2: District 4,5,6

- District 4: E. Oakland, San Leandro, NW Hayward; 87.6% protected-class district, 6 BART stations + 2 shared (Hayward, S. Hayward)
- District 5: SE Alameda County; 3 BART stations + 1 shared (Hayward)
- District 6: Union City, Newark, Fremont, SW Hayward; 3 BART stations + 1 shared (S. Hayward)





Plan E2: District 7,8,9

- District 7: SF Bayview District + W. Oakland,
 Piedmont, Alameda; 6 BART stations + 1 shared
- District 8: Chinatown, Marina District, Pacific Heights, Richmond District, Sunset District, Balboa Park; 1 BART station + 5 shared
- District 9: Central SF (incl. Western Addition, Mission District, Potrero District), extend to County line; 2 BART stations + 5 shared





Plan E2: Differences (District 1, 3)

- Population change: D1: +1, D3: -1

District 3-E: Maintain boundary at City of Oakland

District 3-2E: District 1 to Alameda County line Orinda Village 3-E2










Plan E2: Differences (District 4)

Plan E2: Urban Core district








Plan E2: District 4

Population: 87.6% Protected-class, urban core district











District 8: Pacific Heights

- Plan E2 implements actionable feedback from the previous Board meeting (02/24/2022)
- District 4: Urban core + 87.6% protected-class population
- District 7: SF Bayview District, W. Oakland, Piedmont, Alameda; 62.6% protected-class
- District 8: Pacific Heights, Chinatown
- Population variance: 0.09%

- Public and Director engagement, 9 viable maps;
 2011 redistricting: 2 maps
- Maps follow redistricting best practices for population balance, geographic contiguity, etc.
- Board resolution (01/13/2022) to adopt California
 FAIR MAPS Act for increased transparency
- Establish BART districts for the next 10 years
