The Cypress Mandela Training Center (CMTC) submits this report, reflecting the outcomes, data quantified and activities that transpired during the month of June 2014.

### I. Overview to Progress Report

Construction activity on the Oakland Airport Connector Project continued to slow during the reporting period. As a result of this diminution in activity, placement of new apprentices and local residents continues to decrease.

### II. Applicant/Participant Activity during the Report Period

During the reporting period, the Cypress Mandela Training Center staff provided the following assistance to local impact area residents.

- i Provided 23 local resident graduates from the CMTC program with online PTB (Physical Test Battery) and WOI (Worker Orientation Inventory) testing as part of employment consideration for PG&E. The PTB test assesses problem solving and mechanical abilities, while the WOI assesses attitude and behaviors that are considered to be successful in many PG&E jobs. All 23 students passed the PTB (100%); and 80% passed the WOI test. We congratulate each one of them for their commitment to excellence.
- i Provided mentoring and supportive services to local residents and CMTC graduates currently enrolled in 16-week pre-apprenticeship programs.

In assessing the needs of potential program enrollees, project staff has ascertained that the following barriers continue to impact employment opportunities in the construction industry.

- i Drug usage and inability to pass testing
- i Felony arrest records
- i Lack of driver's licenses and reliable transportation
- i Stable housing
- i Mental Health

### III. Local Impact Residents/CMTC Graduates in Apprenticeship Programs

As new work opportunities on the OAC project diminish, staff determined it's time to follow up on the continued employment of local residents on the project and in strategies to utilize in marketing program participants to contractors with other non-OAC project work. Emphasis will be devoted to placing these apprentices with contractors to be involved in upcoming BART construction projects.
