May 14 marks the Bay Area's 21st annual Bike to Work Day when commuters put down their car keys, strap on a helmet and bike to work or BART.

This is the largest event in California encouraging bike commuting as a fun, affordable form of transportation that supports better health every day.

On Bike to Work Day" Energizer Stations" will be located along bike commute routes and at BART stations where bicyclists can stop

for refreshments, giveaways and bicycling information, or simply to be cheered on by fellow participants.

BIKE TO WORK DAY EVENTS AT BART STATIONS

Start Bike to Work Day off right with a stop at a BART Bike Station. Snacks, drinks and camaraderie will be available at the Fruitvale Bike Station. Stop by the Downtown Berkeley Bike Station and enjoy fresh, hot pancakes, coffee and juice (while supplies last).

Extended hours for Oakland's Broadway Shuttle

Downtown Oakland residents, workers and revelers can now ride the "Free B" Broadway Shuttle until 10 pm Monday through Thursday. The shuttle also runs until 1 am on Fridays and Saturdays, until the last BART trains depart from the 12th St./Oakland City Center and 19th St./Oakland BART stations. Launched in 2010 to provide fast, convenient access to downtown's offices, social services, and Oakland's growing number of restaurants, art galleries and entertainment venues, the Free B connects passengers to BART, AC Transit, Capitol Corridor, Amtrak and the San Francisco Bay Ferry.

The route also weaves together all of downtown's neighborhoods: Jack London Square, Chinatown, Old Oakland, Central Downtown, Uptown, Lake Merritt, KONO and the Valdez Triangle.

Explore Oakland's hottest neighborhoods **JACK LONDON SOUARE OLD OAKLAND**

What to do? Tour Blue Bottle Coffee: rent a what's behind the slanted door at Heinold's First and Last Chance. Ride BART to 12th St/ Oakland, and transfer to the free Broadway Shuttle (exit at the Embarcadero stop).

CHINATOWN

What to do? Eat hand-made sesame paste noodles at Shan Dong; grab dessert from Wonder Food Bakery (cash only); or take a City of Oakland walking tour (90 minutes). Ride BART to 12 St/Oakland City Center. Or take the Free Broadway Shuttle, exit at the 9th Street stop.

What to do? Eat shrimp tacos from Cosecha kayak and explore the Oakland Estuary; or see in Swan's Market; Shop for made in the USA goods from Marion and Rose's Workshop: or people watch at Café 817. Ride BART to 12 St/Oakland City Center. Or take the Free Broadway Shuttle, exit at the 9th Street stop.

UPTOWN

What to do? Mingle at the Art Murmur on the first Friday of the month; see a classic film at the Paramount Theatre; or shop for raw jeans and menswear at Two Jacks Denim. Ride BART to 19th St/Oakland. Or take the Free Broadway Shuttle, exit at the 20th Street stop.

Park your ride at a BART **Bike Station**

BART operates several of the largest bike stations in the nation, providing safe, secure indoor bike parking. Each station offers different services, including valet parking, self-service parking, bike rentals, bike repairs, classes and events.

DOWNTOWN BERKELEY STATION

The Downtown Berkeley Bike Station is located at 2208 Shattuck Ave., just steps away from the BART entrance at Allston Way and Shattuck Avenue and offers free valet parking from 7am to 9pm. 24-hour self-service parking, repairs and sales, classes and special

19TH STREET UPTOWN STATION

The Uptown Bike Station is located at the corner of 19th Street and Broadway in the heart of downtown Oakland. The indoor station offers free, secure bike storage from 7 am to 9 pm, Monday through Friday, and a full-service repair shop.

FRUITVALE STATION

The Fruitvale Bike Station features free, secure bike storage from 6am to 8pm and a full-service repair shop adjacent to Fruitvale BART.

ASHBY STATION

The Ashby Bike Station is located just outside the main entrance to the station. It is a self-service facility and requires a BikeLink Card.

EMBARCADERO STATION

The Embarcadero Bike Station is located on the concourse level below Market Street, near the Davis Street entrance. It is a self-service facility and requires a BikeLink Card.



Tracks closed some weekends through August

Vital repairs are needed to the equipment and tracks between Fruitvale and Coliseum stations. The work requires that the entire track be shut down and that no trains operate between these stations while it is being performed. To cause the least amount of inconvenience, we are scheduling this work mostly on Saturday nights and all day Sunday on some weekends through August.

To accommodate your travel while the work is being done, we will have a "bus bridge" providing lifeline service for

customers who don't have other options. The buses will carry customers between the two stations. There will be no additional charge for the bus. The bus bridge will cause 30-60 minute delays for some customers.

We recommend that you avoid travel between Fruitvale and Coliseum on the designated weekends if possible.

Before traveling, check bart.gov and look for bulletins in the station for new or updated information. Visit bart.gov for work schedule and more information.

for the Free B – ridership since inception surpassed three million as workers, residents and visitors left their cars at home and hopped aboard the clean diesel shuttles to commute, shop and eat.

All this ridership has translated into a smaller carbon footprint for Oakland and

the region. The Free B reduces vehicle miles driven by 3.3 million each year and eliminates four tons of annual automobile emissions.

The Free B is operated under a contract with AC Transit and funded by an innovative public/private partnership.
