Customer satisfaction with BART on the rise

Customers' overall satisfaction with BART is up with gains in ratings for on-time performance and cleanliness of seats, reflecting investments in the system such as the installation of new, easier-to-clean vinyl seats.

The rankings came in the latest BART Customer Satisfaction Survey, which is conducted every two years. Full survey results will be released in a report later in

You can download the Customer Satisfaction Survey presentation that includes the preliminary results at bart.gov.

Overall satisfaction is up by two points in the 2012 survey compared with 2010, to 84% from 82% -- meaning 84% of respondents said they were very satisfied or somewhat satisfied with the services provided by BART.

Pretax commuter benefits increase for 2013

Want to save up to \$1,500 per year in income taxes?

Take advantage of tax-free dollars to pay for BART tickets and parking through employer-sponsored programs. As of January 2013, the tax-free transportation benefits have increased to \$240 per month and up to \$240 per month for qualified transit parking (including parking at BART stations.)

Employees who set aside income on a pre-tax basis do not pay federal income or payroll taxes on the income set aside. If you have a combined (local, state, federal) tax rate of 40% and spend \$240 per month on BART fares, you will save nearly \$100 each month or \$1,200 a year. If you pay for monthly BART parking at \$63 per month, you can save an additional \$25 per month or \$300 per year.

Happy New Year to you all and thank you for continuing to ride BART in 2013!

We have some good news to report that will help you save money on BART this year. Based on the American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012, employers can enable their employees to use pre-tax income to pay for up to \$240 per month in transit fares plus up to \$240 per month in transit parking costs. If you have a combined (local, state, federal) tax rate of 40% and spend \$240 per month on BART fares, you will save nearly \$100 each month or \$1,200 a year. If you pay for monthly BART parking at \$63 per month, you can save an additional \$25 per month or \$300 per year. For more details visit bart.gov/pretax.
