Earthquake Upgrade Construction to Begin Along the North Oakland Aerial Structures

February 2009

Dear Community Member:

As part of our system-wide Earthquake Safety Program, strengthening work begins in 2009 on the North Oakland aerial structures, which spans from Sycamore Street to the Berkeley Hills Tunnel. The work includes: adding steel and concrete to foundations, wrapping columns with steel reinforcements, and protecting utilities and equipment. Work hours are 7:00 am – 7:00 pm, Monday through Friday. During the project, you can expect temporary sidewalk and lane closures, also temporary reduction of available street parking. Below are the approximate construction start dates and locations of work. Please watch for signs with safety information and other notices. We appreciate your patience during this work, and will attempt to minimize construction-related noise, dust and inconvenience.
