Welcome to BART at Oakland **International Airport**



The Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) rail system provides service from the Oakland International Airport (OAK) BART Station to downtown

San Francisco, the East Bay and Peninsula cities.

Avoid traffic, parking hassles and the high cost of taxis, rental cars and bridge tolls by taking BART from Oakland International Airport to your destination.

BART operates routes to 48 conveniently located stations in the San Francisco Bay Area.

BART Fares and Tickets

Buy your train ticket at the BART station. Fares are based on where you are going. BART ticket machines at the station accept debit/credit cards and U.S. currency only. Currency exchange and ATMs are not available at the BART station, so be sure to use these services at the airport before you get there.

Shuttle Trains to the BART Coliseum Station

The entrance to the BART Oakland International Airport (OAK) Station is located between Terminals 1 and 2 as you exit the airport. Use the escalators or elevators to access the elevated platform and wait for a BART shuttle train to take you to the BART Coliseum Station. The trip from the airport to the Coliseum Station will take about **8 minutes**.

Once there, you must purchase a BART ticket to your final destination. Brochures, information displays and ticket vending machines are conveniently located where you exit the shuttle.



Shuttle Train Hours and Frequency

Shuttle trains arrive throughout the day; from approximately 5 am to Midnight on weekdays, 6 am to Midnight on Saturdays, and 8 am to Midnight on Sundays as follows:


Quick Tips

- Each person in your travel party must have a BART ticket.
- Purchase tickets at ticket vending machines using debit/credit card or cash.
- Build in a bit of extra time to make your connection to a train at the BART Coliseum Station if you need to purchase a ticket.
- Travel time from BART Coliseum Station to downtown San Francisco is approximately 30 minutes.
