BOARD RESOLUTION 2495
BART PARKING REGULATIONS

Adopted June 24, 1976

RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit District (hereafter "District") upon the effective date of this Resolution adopts the following conditions and regulations applicable to vehicle parking and traffic in District parking facilities:

- BR2495-1 No person shall drive, stop, park or leave standing any vehicle, as defined in Section 670 of the California Vehicle code, on any District parking facility except in full compliance with the traffic laws of the State of California and conditions and regulations adopted herein pursuant to Section 21113 of the California Vehicle Code. As used herein the term "District parking facility" includes reference to entrances and exits to and from any such facility.
- BR2495-2 No person other than a District patron shall park any vehicle in any District parking facility except with the express permission of an authorized representative of the District. For purposes of this Resolution, a District patron is defined as a person who parks a vehicle in a District parking facility adjacent to a District station and who thereafter directly proceeds to enter the paid area of the adjacent District station.
- BR2495-3 No person shall at any time drive any vehicle in any District parking facility at a speed in excess of 15 miles per hour, unless otherwise posted.
- BR2495-4 No person shall park or leave standing any vehicle in any District parking facility for a period longer than seventy-two consecutive hours or in a parking space in any such facility for a period in excess of any time limitation or restriction indicated by posted signs or other markings. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a District patron who has made suitable arrangements with an authorized representative of the District may park a vehicle in any District parking facility for a period in excess of seventy-two hours.
- BR2495-5 No person at any time shall stop, park, or leave standing any vehicle in any District parking facility, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a peace officer, in any of the following places:

- a) Alongside curb space where no parking is indicated by a sign or curb space painted red;
- b) On a crosswalk;
- c) In front of a driveway;
- d) Within fifteen (15) feet of a fire hydrant, except vehicles owned or operated by a fire department and clearly marked as such;
- e) Alongside curb space painted yellow except commercially licensed or government vehicles while engaged in loading and unloading but in no case for a period of time exceeding fifteen (15) minutes;
- f) Alongside curb space painted white except vehicles stopping to load and unload passengers but no case for a period of time exceeding five (5) minutes;
- g) In any place marked as parking for handicapped persons only except vehicles owned and operated by physically handicapped persons and clearly identifiable as such;
- h) In any place other than within a parking space clearly marked as such by white or yellow lines on the pavement. And in no instance shall a vehicle occupy more than one parking space as delineated by such lines.

- BR2495-6 No person shall drive, park or leave standing in any District parking facility any vehicle or combination of vehicles which exceeds three tons in total aggregate weight or exceeds six and one-half feet in width or nineteen feet in length.
- BR2495-7 No person shall park or leave standing any motorcycle or motor-powered bicycle on District property except in areas specifically designated for such purpose in District parking facilities.
- BR2495-8 Permission to enter a District parking facility may be revoked at any time by any authorized agent of the District and the District reserves the right to restrict the use of any parking space at any time.
- BR2495-9 No person shall park or leave standing any vehicle in the District's Lake Merritt parking facility without immediately thereafter depositing a parking fee of twenty-five (25) cents for each twenty-four (24) hour period in the proper numbered slot of the parking fee deposit box located within the paid area of the Lake Merritt station. (Note: As of October 1993, electronic parking control machines were installed at Lake Merritt station. Patrons are required to deposit twenty-five cents and enter the parking stall number, and the machine then issues a validation

receipt.)

- BR2495-10 No person shall park or leave standing any vehicle in the District's Coliseum parking facility in any space specifically designated for patron use only at any time during which parking fees are imposed for non-patron parking in said facility, unless such person is a District patron and immediately identifies himself as such and the location of his vehicle upon entering the paid area of the Coliseum station.
- BR2495-11 Publicly and privately owned bus systems and taxis shall obtain written permission from an authorized District representative prior to operating on District property:
- a) Buses shall utilize those zones which have been designated as bus stops for the loading and unloading of their passengers;
 - b) Taxis shall utilize those zones which have been designated as taxi zones for the loading and unloading of their passengers;
 - c) Buses and taxis shall also comply with those rules regarding location and duration of stops as set forth in writing by the authorized District representative.
