Recently there have been statements made by Directors in the press indicating that they believe a violation of the Brown Act occurred in closed session on February 10, 2011.

The District takes allegations of violation of the Brown Act seriously, as the Act serves the important purpose of ensuring that the public has access to certain deliberations of the Board. Generally, the Brown Act bars a lawsuit against the public agency if the Board cures the alleged wrongful action in a timely manner.

At the request of Director Keller, I have prepared such a cure in response to the action that occurred on February 10, 2011. The cure in this instance is a public announcement of the votes that occurred.

ANNOUNCEMENT:

The Board voted in closed session at the Regular meeting of February 10, 2011, under the topic of Public Employee Performance Evaluation - General Manager, to seek the resignation of the General Manager. All nine members were present, with five voting in favor. Those five were Directors Fang, Franklin, McPartland, Raburn and Radulovich. Following this vote, the Board voted in closed session to rescind this action and that motion passed unanimously with all members voting.
