BART Fares and Clipper Payment

Children 4 and under ride free. All other passengers must pay by using a contactless bank card (all major cards accepted), Google Pay or Apple Pay, purchasing a regional Clipper transit card at a vending machine or adding Clipper to a digital wallet (phones/watches).

Each rider must have their own individual card or device for payment. Families sharing a credit card number may use contactless payment as long as each rider uses a different physical card or device.

Fares are based on distance traveled and posted at bart.gov/fares and on the Clipper vending machines. Physical Clipper cards have a one-time acquisition fee of \$3.00. There is no fee when using contactless options or adding Clipper to your digital wallet.

Not all Bay Area transit agencies currently accept contactless bank cards to pay fares. If you plan to use other transit, add Clipper to your phone or purchase a Clipper card.

When using a digital Clipper Card with Google Pay/ Apple Pay, funds can be added for immediate use without the need to use a vending machine. Clipper vending machines accept debit/credit cards and cash. Currency exchange and ATMs are not available at BART stations. Weekly or monthly passes are not available.

To enter the BART system, tap your payment method (bank card, Clipper card or digital device) on the blue disc on the top or side of the fare gate. Be sure to use the same payment method when you exit. The correct fare will be deducted automatically. If your Clipper card has too little value, the fare gate will tell you to go to an Addfare machine to add enough value to exit BART.

Luggage and Accessibility

Luggage may be stowed under your seat or held in your lap. Please keep the doorways clear. BART trains have space near the doors to accommodate wheelchairs, bikes or strollers. If the space is not being used by a person with a disability, you may store your luggage there, but please keep it under control at all times. All BART stations have elevators and wide fare gates for luggage and for use by people with disabilities.





