This report contains statistical data compiled by the BART Police Office of Internal Affairs, addressing the number and nature of misconduct allegations resulting from Complaints and Administrative Investigations. Additionally, the report enumerates use of force statistics.

Annual Report

Internal Affairs Overview

The BART Police Office of Internal Affairs received 119 complaints regarding police conduct during 2024.

- Of the 119 complaints, 108 were reported and investigated as Formal Complaints.
- An additional two inquiries were received by Internal Affairs. One was addressed through an Administrative Closure and the other was closed as an Inquiry.
- Of the 119 complaints, there were a total of 321 allegations. Sixteen cases were closed through Administrative Closure which did not receive an allegation. Five cases have been tolled, and two remain under investigation through OIPA.

There were 11 Administrative Investigations initiated by the Office of Internal Affairs.

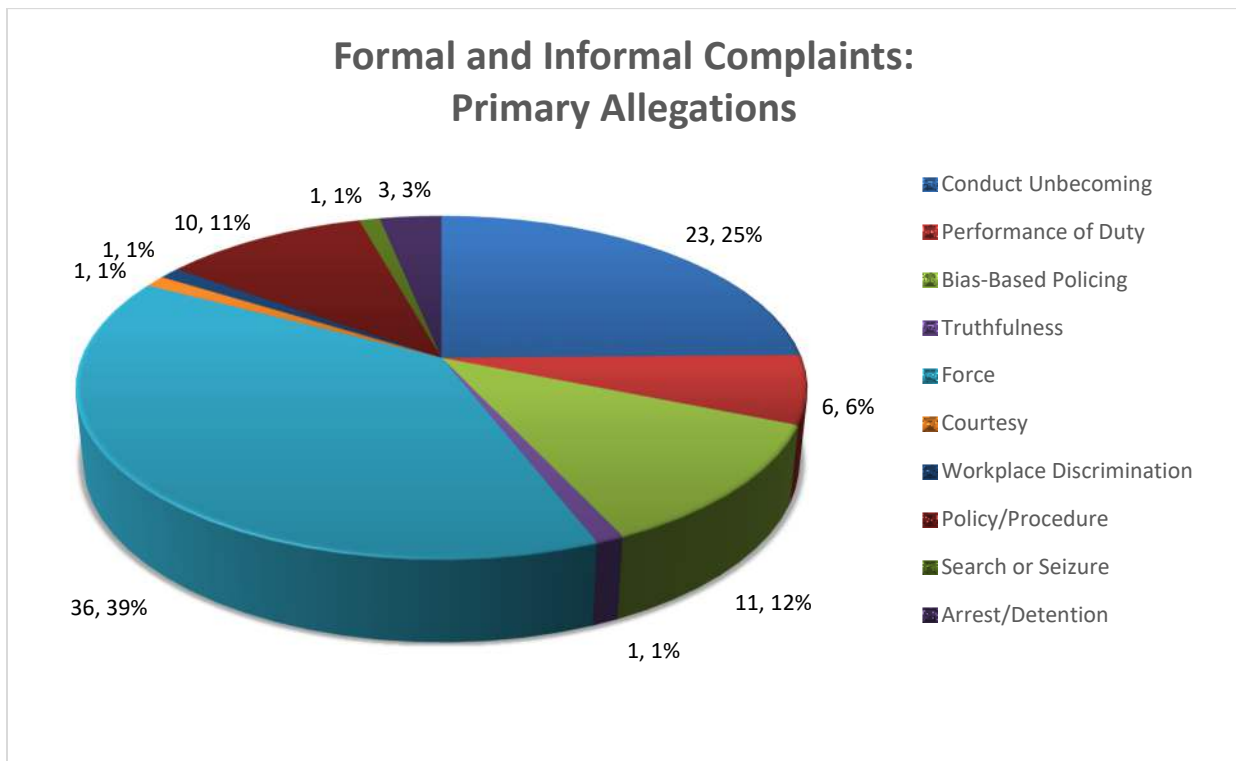

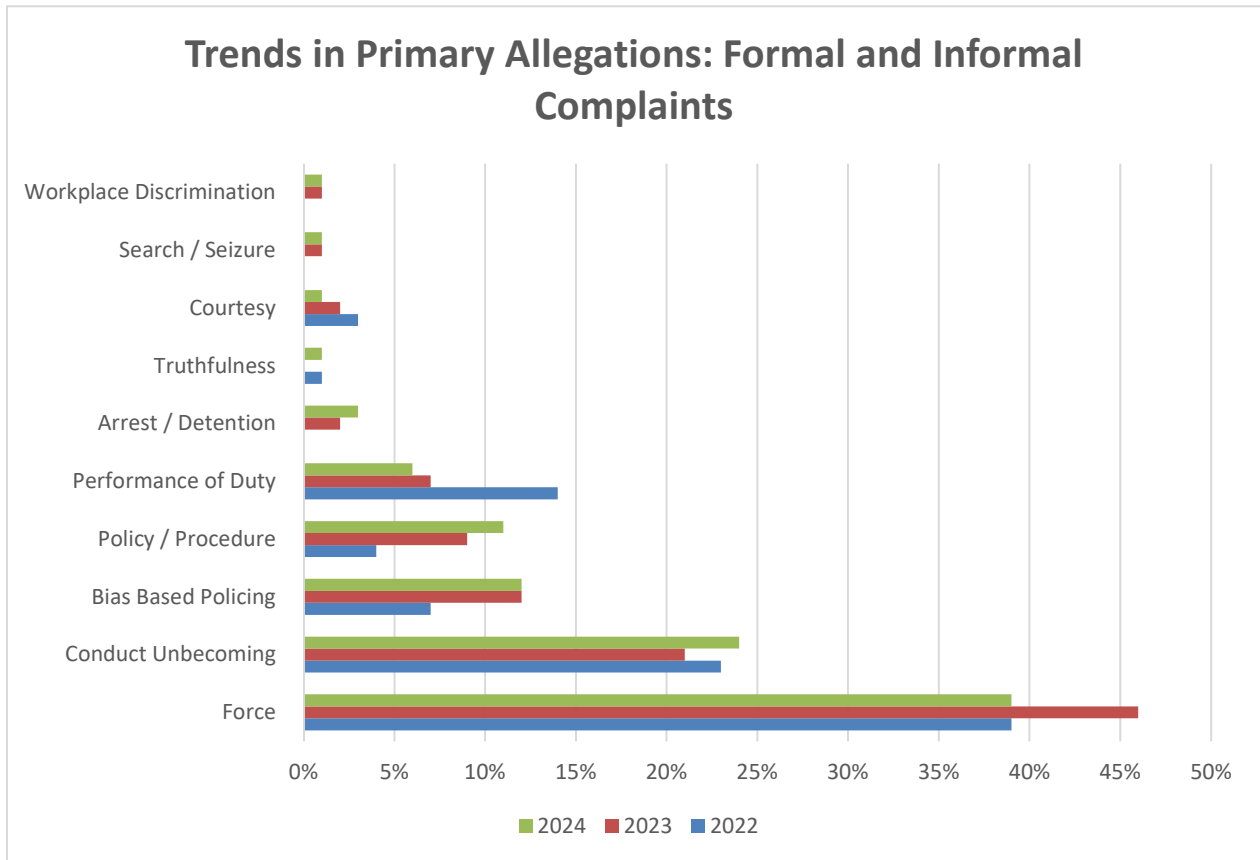
Allegations for Formal and Informal Complaints:

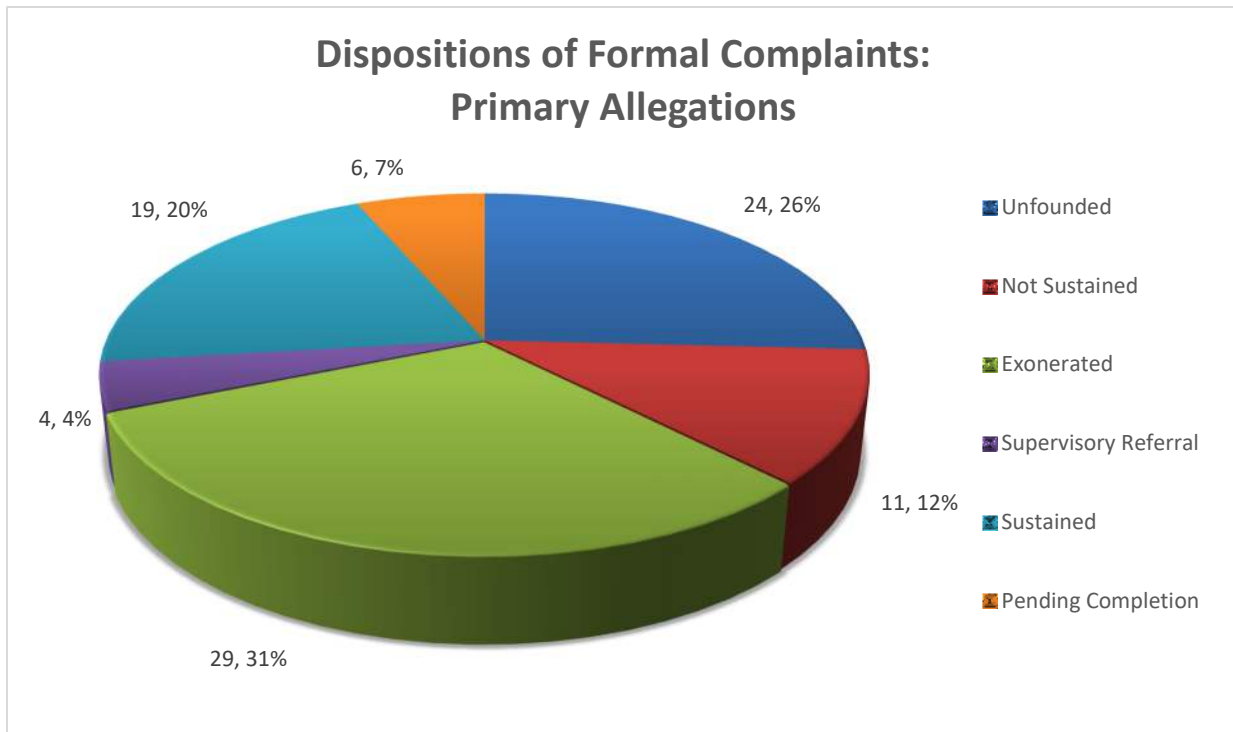


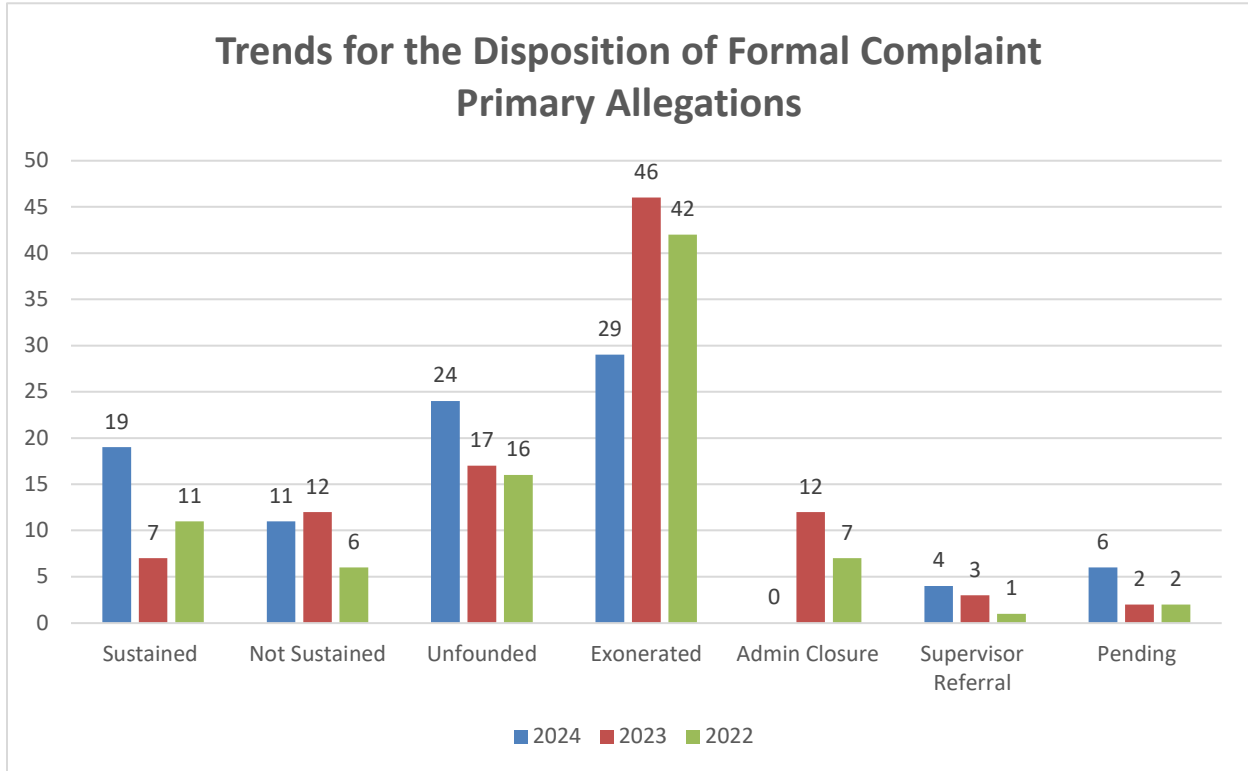

Beginning with cases for 2024, administrative closures were closed according to Policy 1020.1.1(i): Allegations that are received and documented; however the Chief of Police or his/her designee determines, based on a preliminary investigation, that further investigation is not warranted. Under these circumstances, the complaint will be Administratively Closed and documented in a summary memorandum to the case file. Employees will be documented as witnesses only, not as subjects to the complaint.

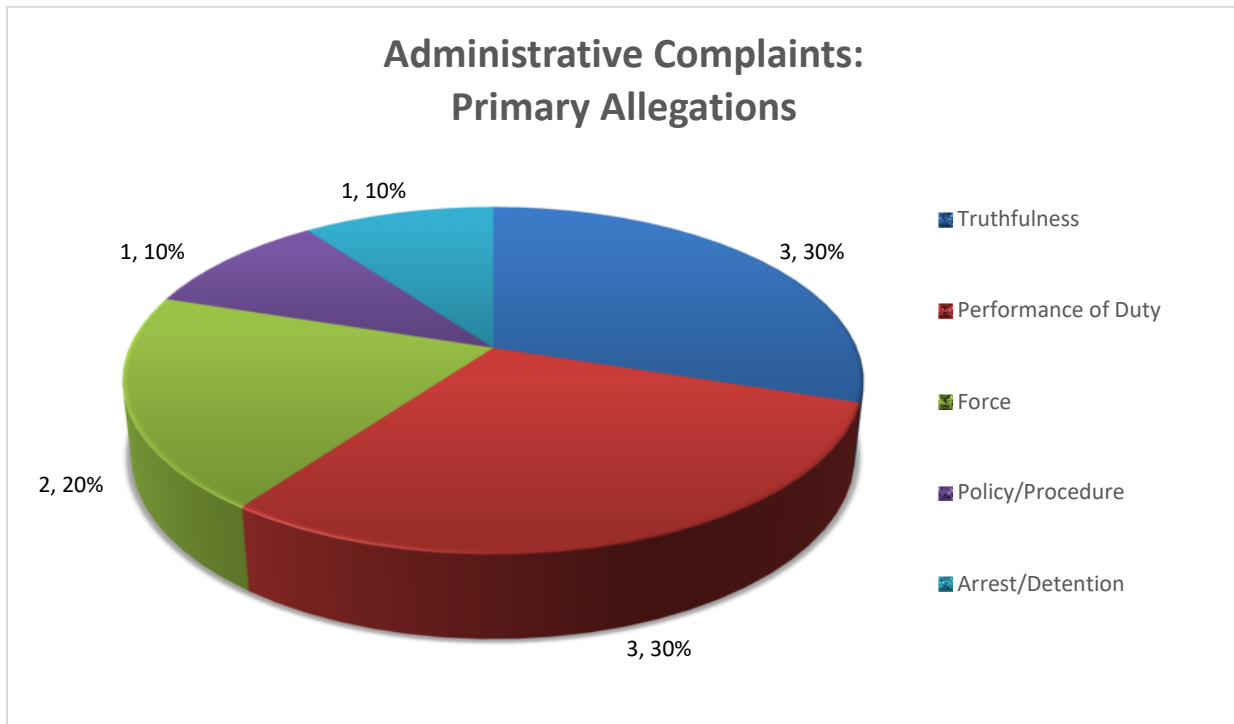

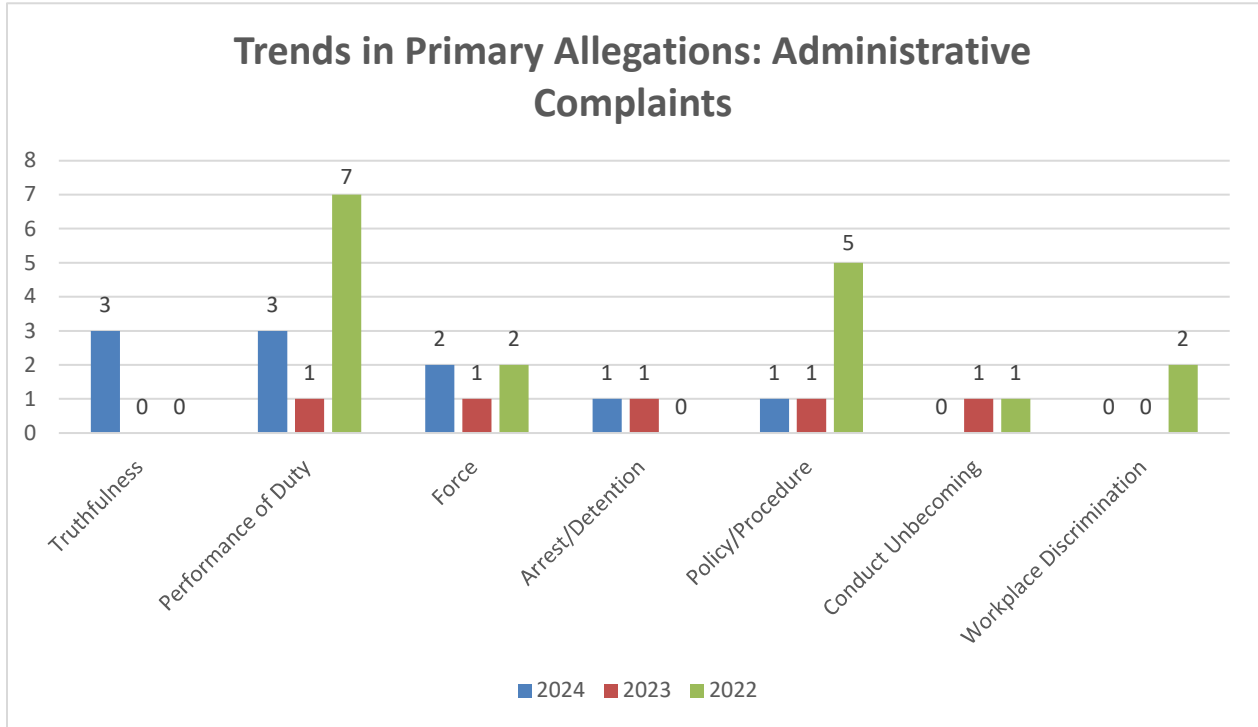
Administrative Investigations:

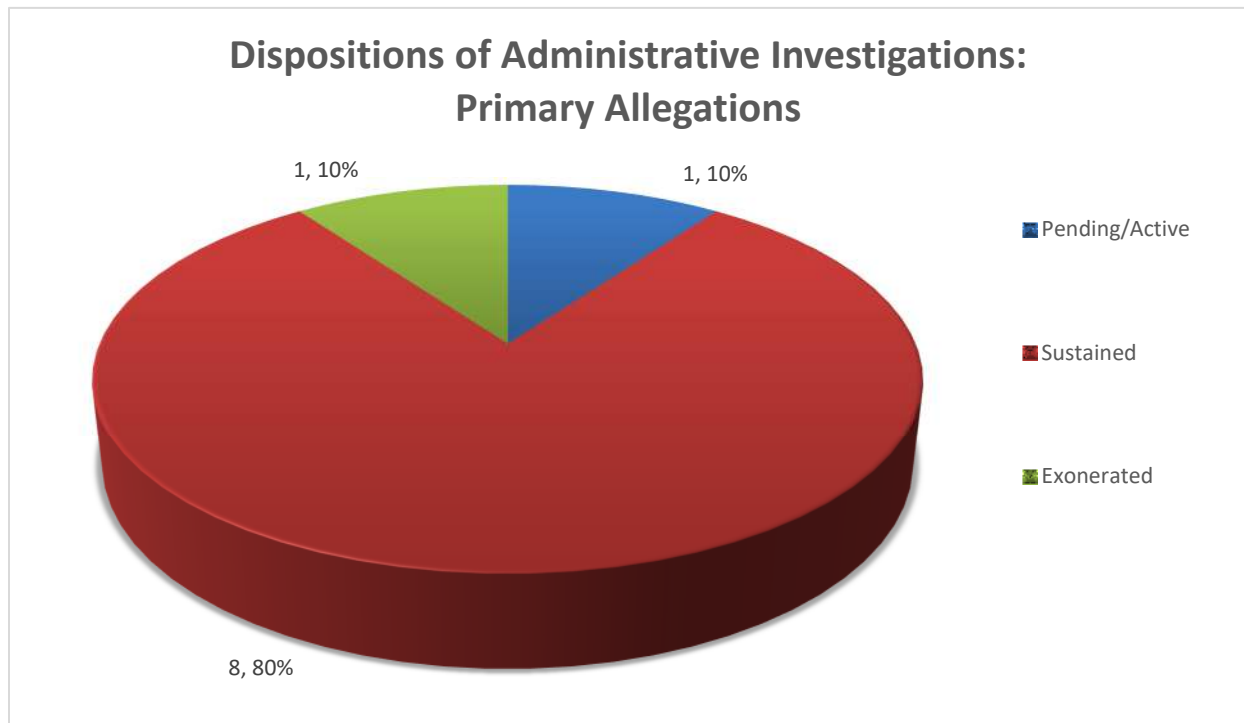

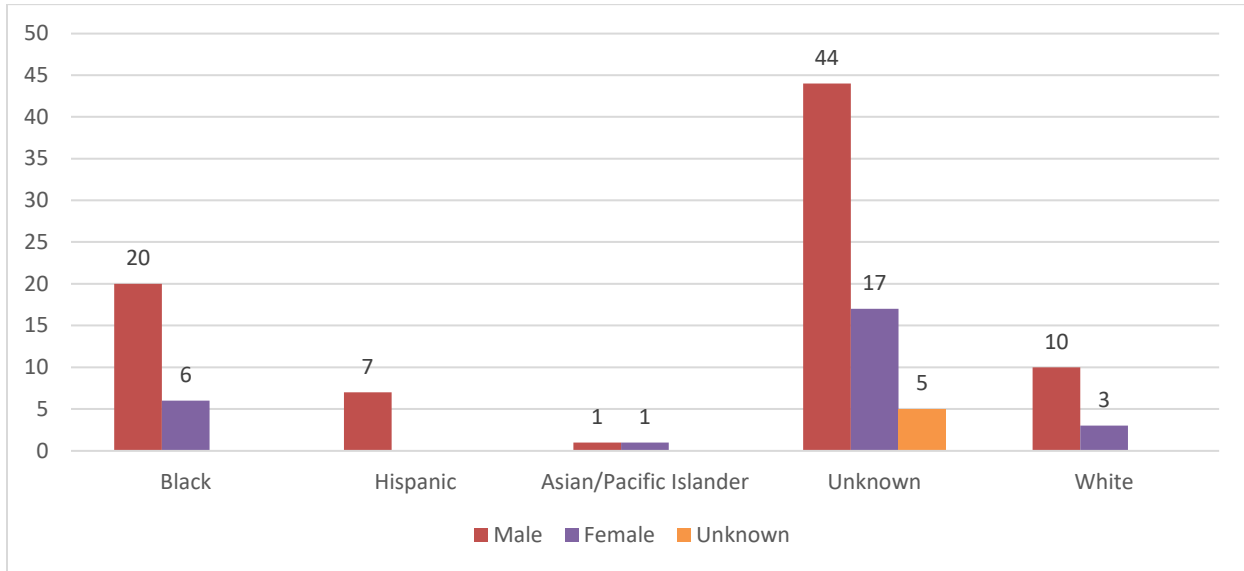

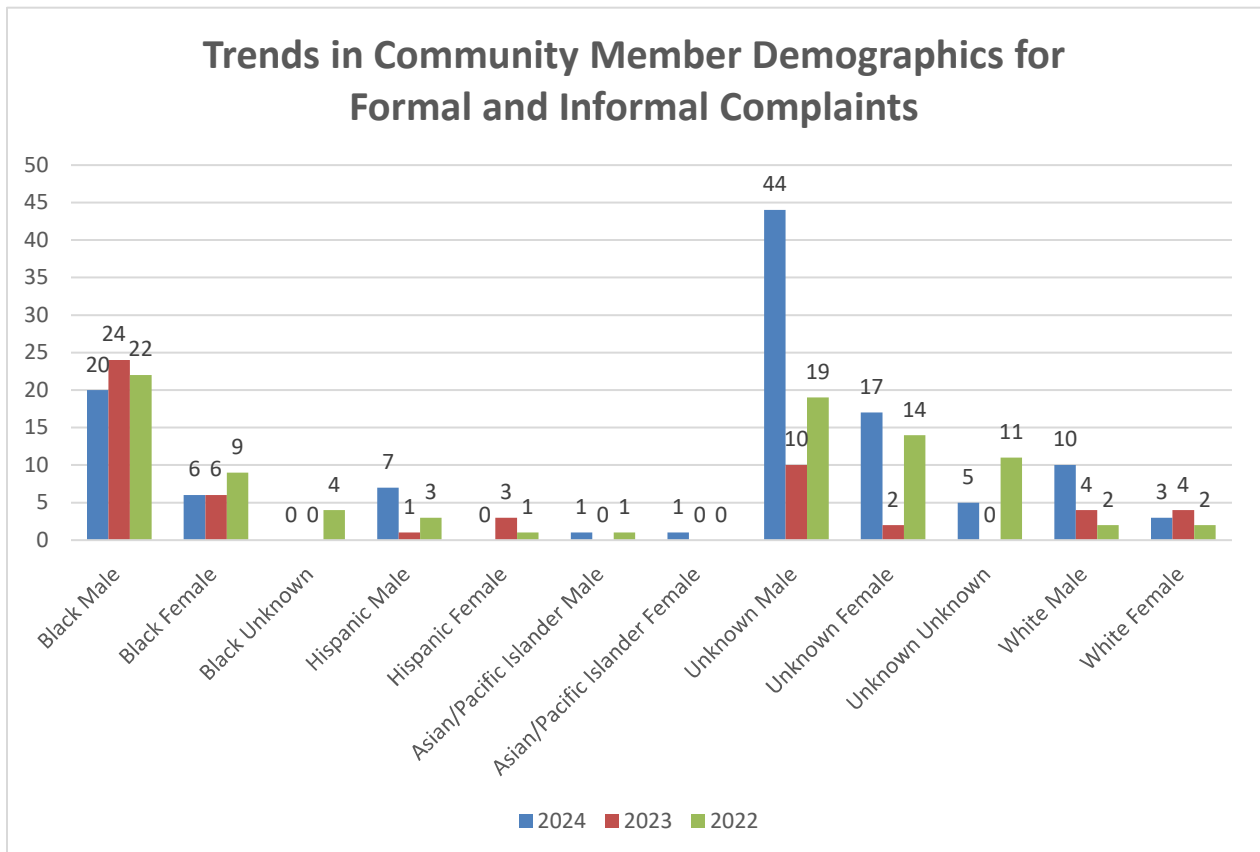

Community Member Demographics for Formal and Informal Complaints:

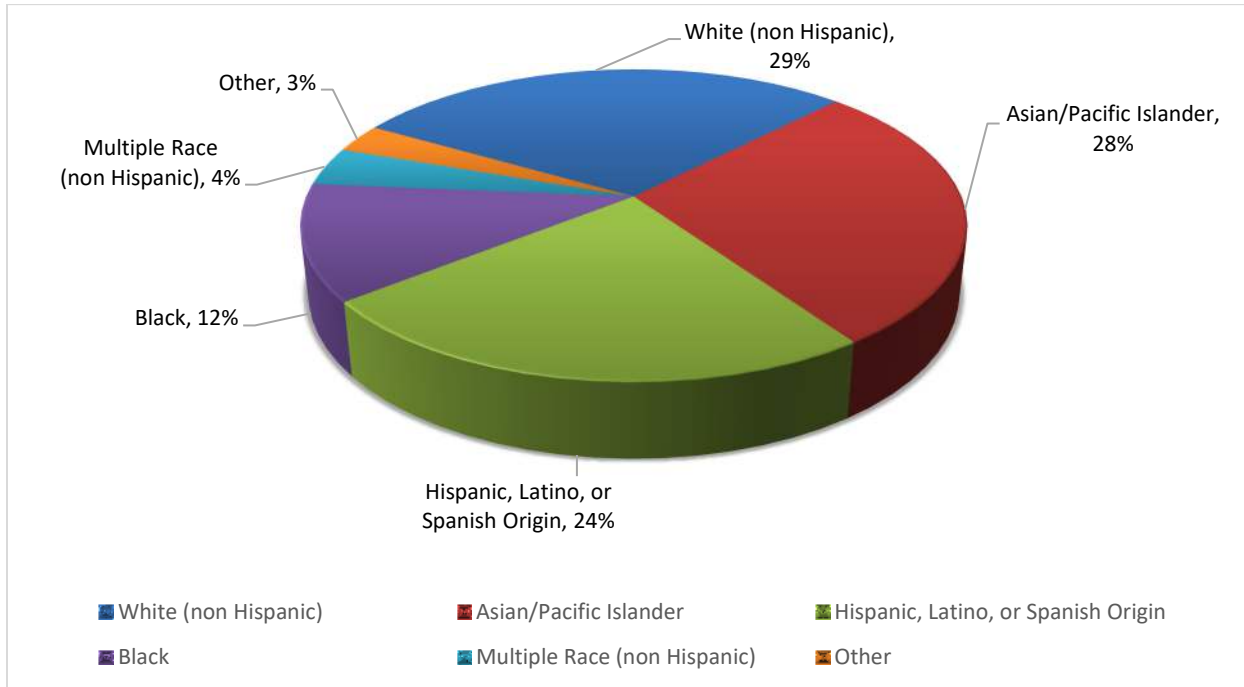

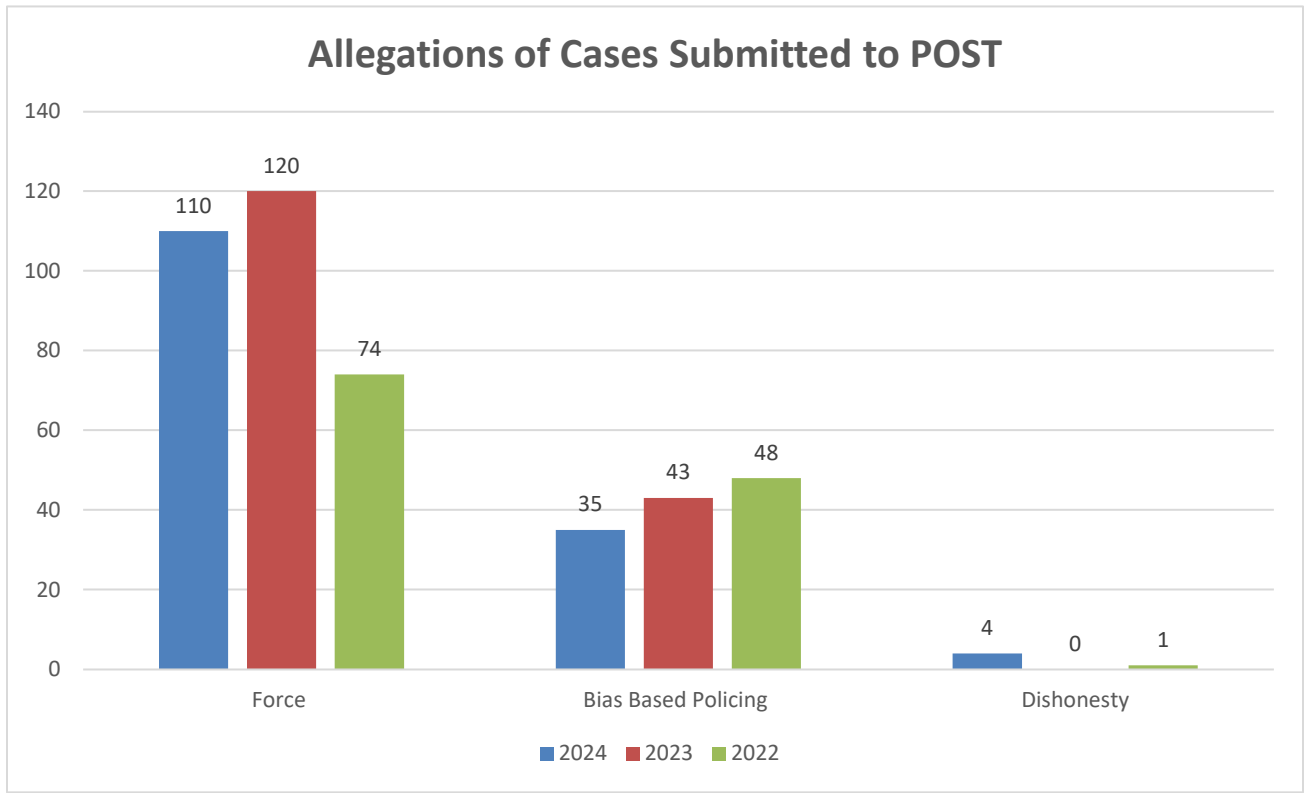

SB 2 / POST / Mark43



*Cases may have more than one allegation associated with it.

POST requires each case with allegations of serious misconduct and multiple officers to have a separate report submitted for each officer, as each officer is investigated independently.

Serious misconduct is defined by law as:

- Dishonesty, fraud, or falsifying official records
- Perjury or false statements
- Excessive or unreasonable use of force
- Sexual assault or sexual misconduct
- Abuse of authority
- Serious violations of civil rights
- Criminal conduct
- Domestic violence
- Acts involving moral turpitude

POST makes the decision to revoke certification, impose lesser sanctions, or take no action.
