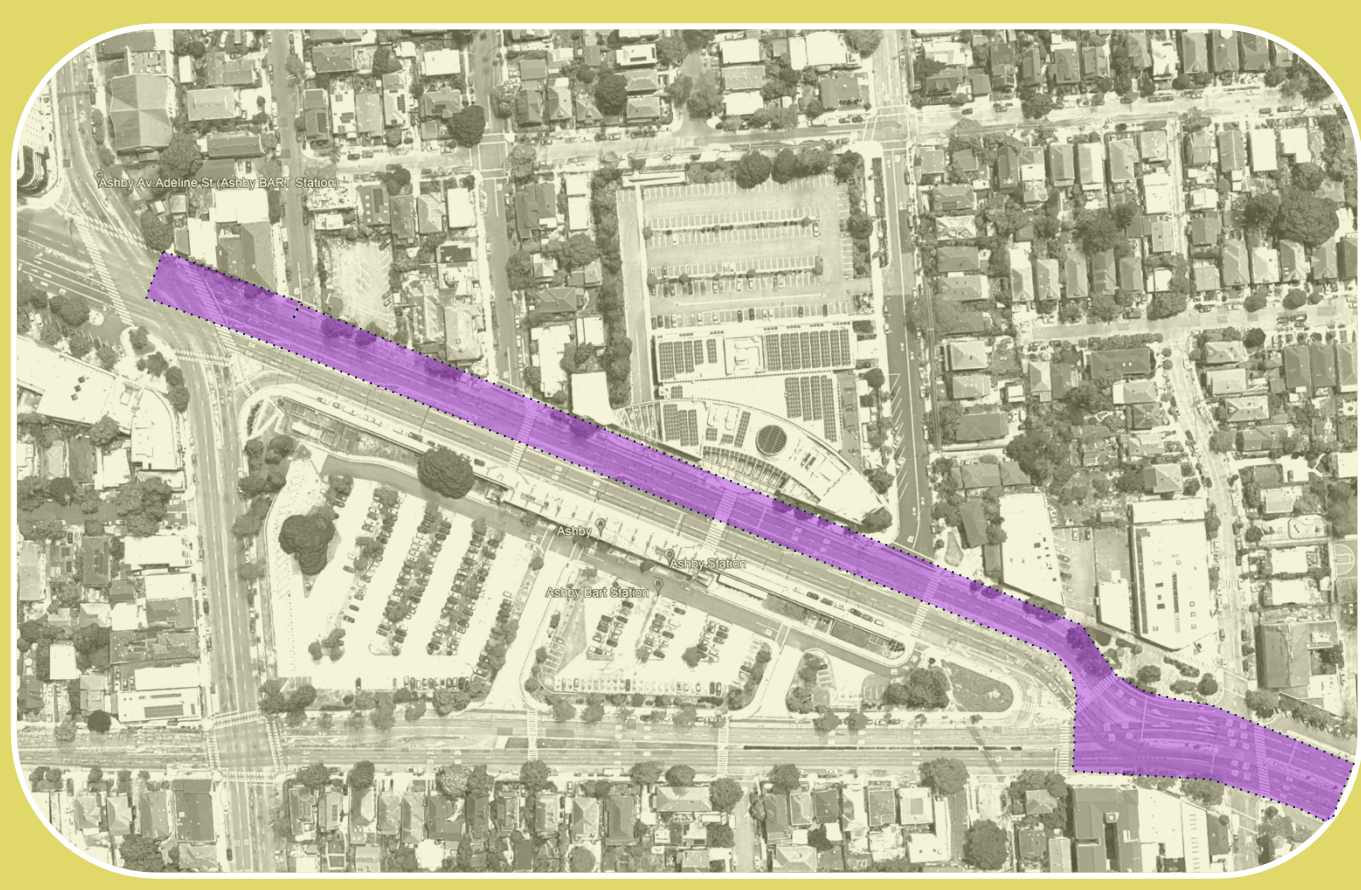

Adeline Transportation Improvements Project (ATIP)

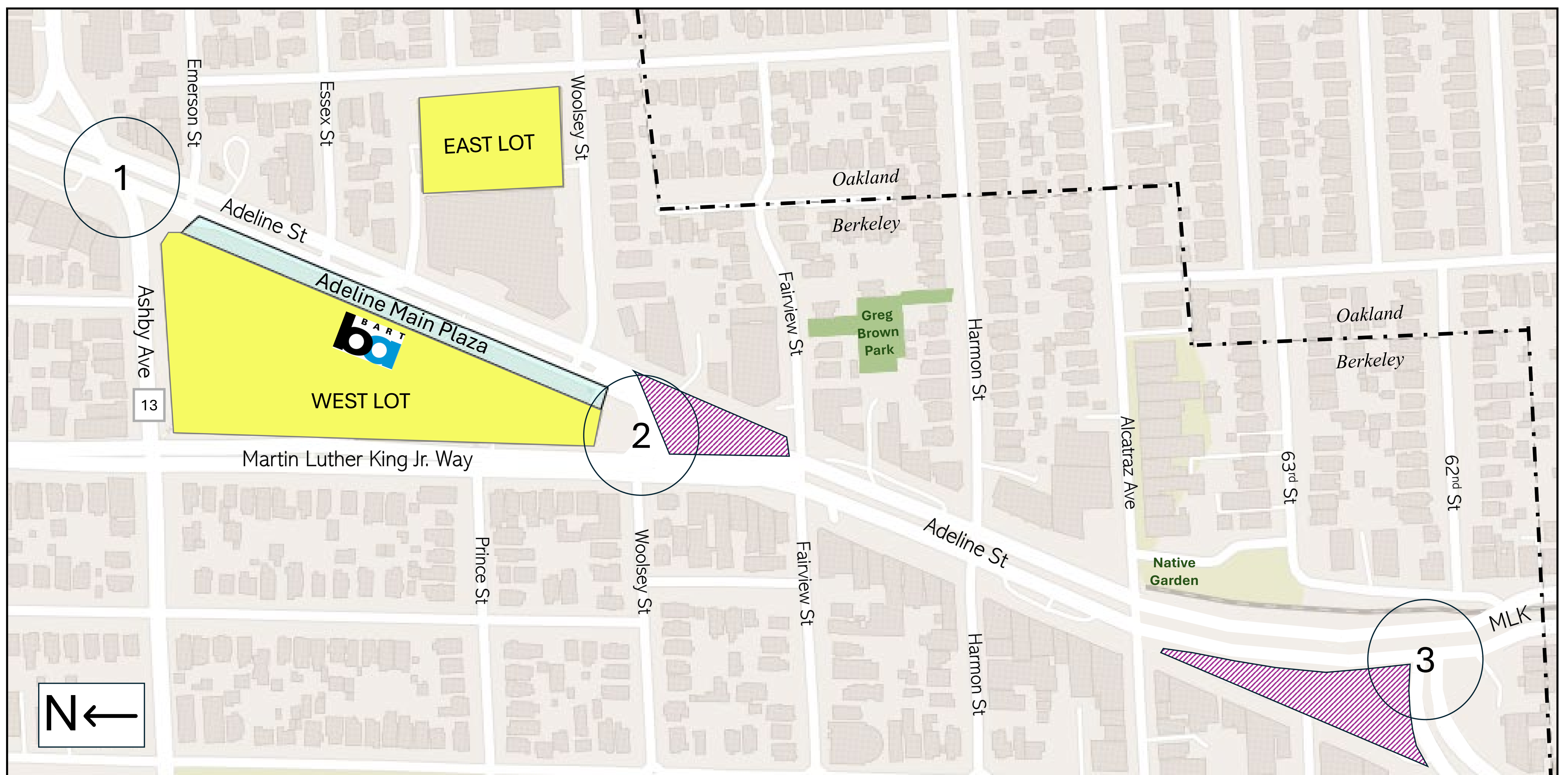
The Adeline Transportation Improvements Project (ATIP) will create a long-term concept plan to improve pedestrian and bicycle safety, transit operations, parking and loading, and public space along Adeline Street from Ashby Avenue to the Berkeley–Oakland border. It builds on the 2020 Adeline Corridor Specific Plan and the Adeline at Ashby BART Conceptual Design, approved by council in 2022.

The project will evaluate intersection changes at Ashby Avenue, Martin Luther King Jr. Way, and Adeline Street/Martin Luther King Jr. Way. The project would also remove a vehicle lane in each direction from Ashby Avenue to Martin Luther King Jr. Way, building on the changes being made in 2027 by the Adeline Quick Build. Lastly, the project would create new public spaces for the community.

Reparative Action Framework

Why?

- Historically, transportation projects have not been grounded in the neighborhoods they passed through. This was particularly true in redlined communities and other geographies where structural racism limited the power of local residents. The community in South Berkeley has consistently organized, advocated, and fought for its future rooted in resilience and hope for what’s possible.
- Today multiple projects including the Ashby BART Transit-Oriented Developments on the East and West Lots, the Adeline Plaza, and the Adeline Transportation Improvement Project—present a rare opportunity to build on the legacy of resilience and community advocacy in this neighborhood. These projects can advance the community’s vision of a right to return, a right to remain, and a right to thrive in South Berkeley.
- The many projects in the Adeline Corridor are aligned in their mission to pursue the established reparative action framework including making community engagement transparent, easy, and respectful of community members’ time and contributions.

How?

- The project team will engage directly with communities in the South Berkeley neighborhood by partnering with local community-based organizations to host meetings and ensure the voices most connected to this place are centered in the decision making process.
- Individual projects will work across lines to realize a holistic neighborhood vision. Individual project presentations will seek to start with shared slides that show all projects, illustrating how each piece connects to the others. Where possible the team will be coordinated in our outreach materials and events.

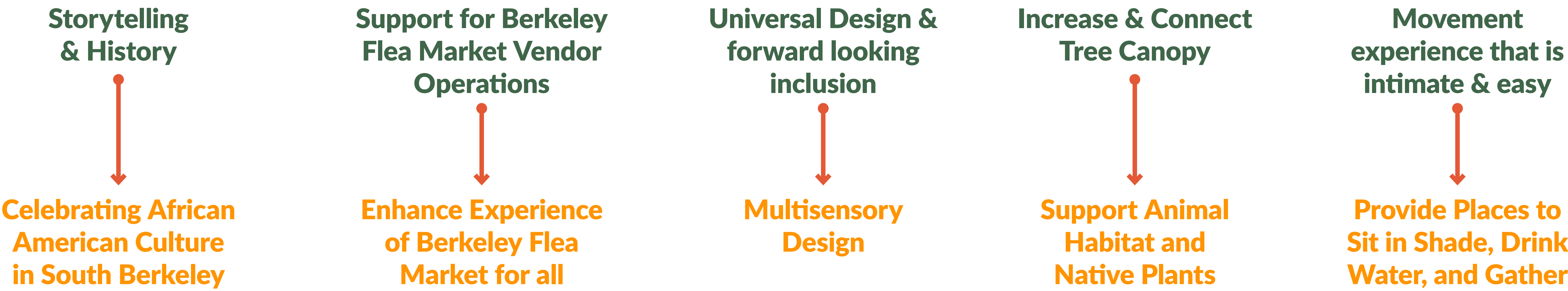

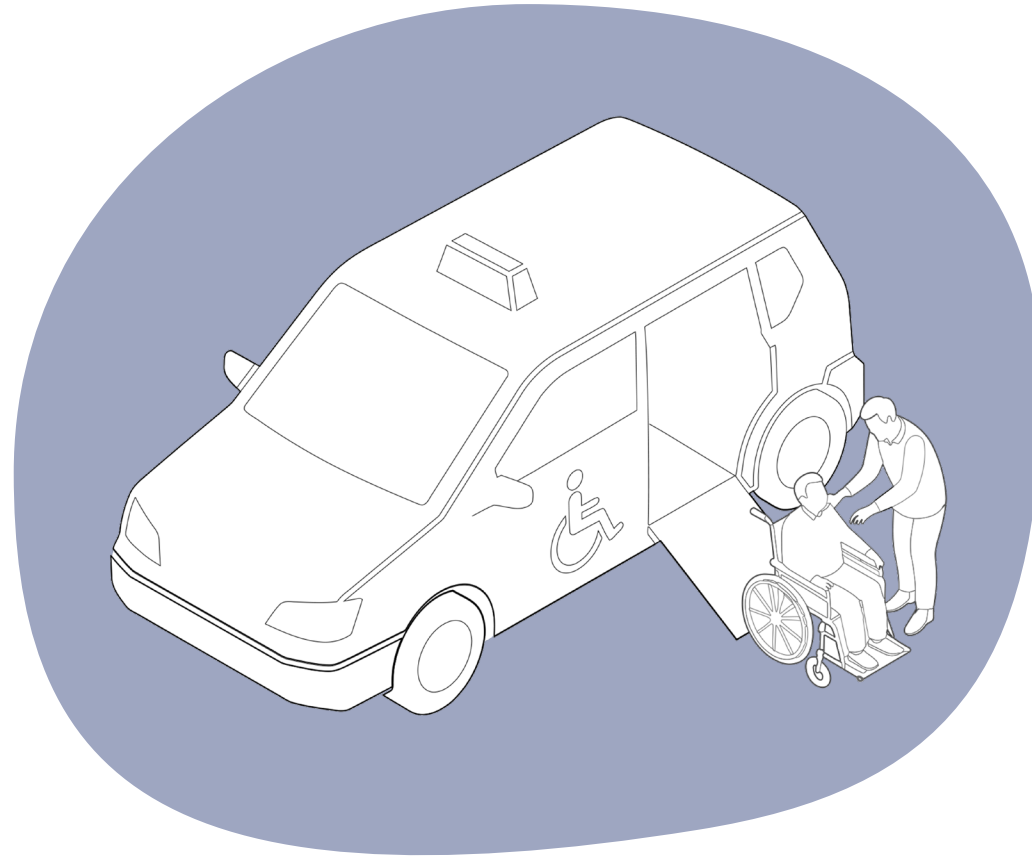

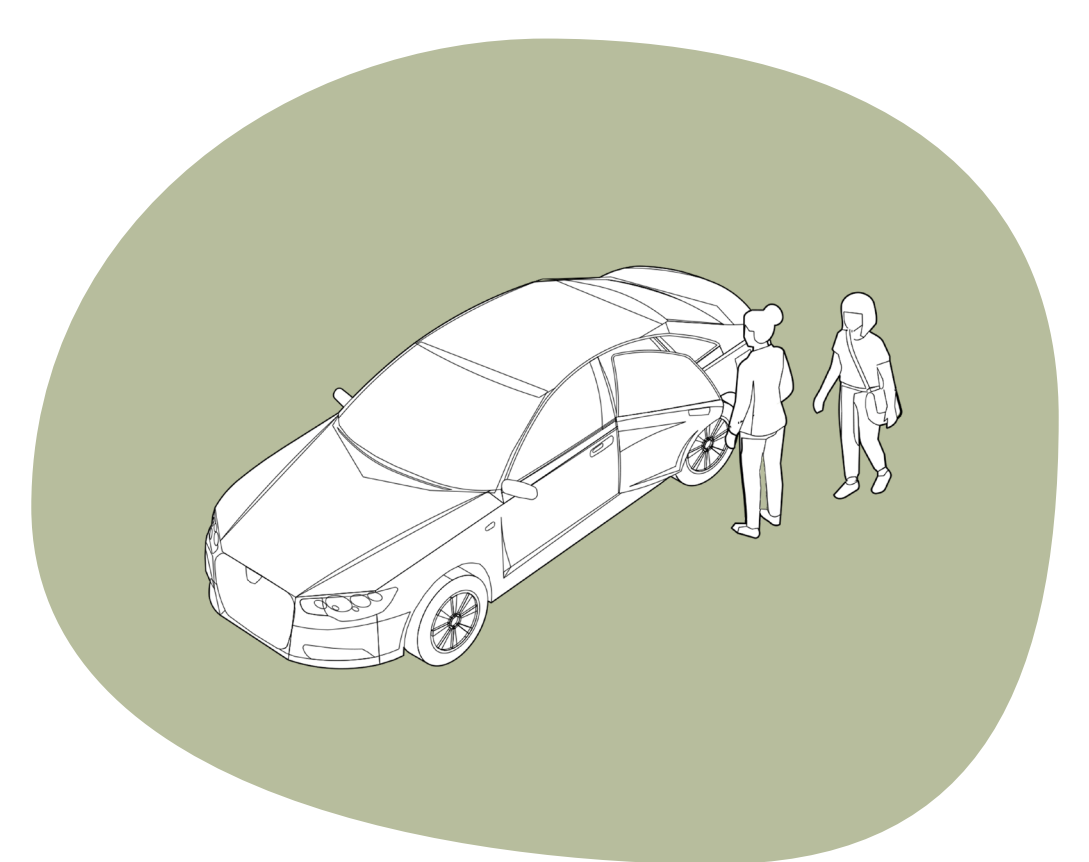
