The regular agenda items include monthly oral reports by the BART Chief of Police and the Independent Police Auditor.

Primary Duties and Responsibilities

The Citizen Oversight Model lists several primary duties and responsibilities for the BPCRB. The general topic headings below describe the BPCRB activities related to these tasks.

At the August 2017 meeting, Kenneth Loo (District 1) and Aman Sebahtu (District 7) were sworn in at Board Members to replace Benjamin Douglas and Sharon Kidd respectively.

At the July 2017 meeting, George Perezvelez (District 9) was elected Chair along with William White (District 3) as Vice Chair.

Receiving complaints, reviewing investigative reports and making recommendations for corrective action.

The Independent Auditor has received a number of complaints and appeals, which are being investigated. During the quarter, one case (OIPA Case #16-25) was presented to the BPCRB and the OIPA recommendations were agreed to by at least a majority of BPCRB members.

Recommendations on Procedures, Practices and Training

During the Quarter, the Board accepted BART Police Department (BPD) Policy 453 recommendation for Aggressive Panhandling. The Board approved Committee recommendations of BPD Policy 300 – Use of Force dated July 3, 2017 and it was forwarded to BPD for implementation.
