# Welcome to BART at San Francisco International Airport



The Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) rail system provides direct service from the San Francisco International Airport (SFO) to downtown

San Francisco, the East Bay and Peninsula cities.

Avoid traffic, parking hassles and the high cost of taxis, rental cars and shuttles by taking BART from the airport to your destination.



#### BART Service Overview

BART operates routes to 46 conveniently located stations in the San Francisco Bay Area.

#### **Service Hours**

Weekdays	4 am – Midnight
Saturdays	6 am – Midnight
Sundays and Holidays	8 am – Midnight

#### **Service Frequency**

Weekdays approx. every 15 minutes
Weekday Evenings approx. every 20 minutes
Weekends and Holidays approx. every 20 minutes

At the BART station, you'll find maps, brochures and Station Agents to help you navigate your journey.



# **Locating the SFO BART Station**

The San Francisco International Airport BART Station is on Level 3 of the International Terminal. The free AirTrain shuttle takes you from the Domestic and International Terminals to "Garage G – BART Station." Travelers arriving at the International Terminal may also walk to BART by following directional signs to the BART station.

Airport-supplied luggage carts are not allowed in the BART station or on the train.

## **Fares and Tickets**

Buy your train ticket at the BART station. Fares are based on where you are going. BART ticket machines at the station accept debit/credit cards and U.S. currency only. Currency exchange and ATMs are not available at the BART station, so be sure to use these services at the airport before you get there.
