Bay Area residents have been thinking about the environment since before the first passenger stepped aboard a BART train in 1972 and BART riders are still helping keep emissions down and

keep our sky blue today. When you choose BART, your're riding the lightest subway cars in the world, so they use less energy. You're riding on trains that are 100% electric and get two-thirds of that power from clean hydro and renewable energy sources. From the General Manager Helping keep the sky blue since 1972...

For forty years, BART riders have been helping keep our Bay Area skies blue. Riding BART instead of driving is an easy and inexpensive way to do your part for the environment.

While a typical automobile gets about 20 miles per gallon, during peak hours a BART rider gets the equivalent of 249 miles per gallon. Not even the most fuel efficient hybrid can match that. An individual BART rider travelling round-trip on weekdays for a year saves over 303 gallons of gas and keeps 5,868 pounds of CO₂ out of the air. On a single weekday, all BART riders keep over 4 million pounds of CO, out of the air and save 200,000 gallons of gas.

Late-night work to strengthen Transbay Tube

Starting last month and continuing through the spring of 2014 BART will be working in the Transbay Tube to improve your safety in the event of an earthquake. This project requires specialized equipment and takes longer than the 3-4 hours that are normally available after BART closes each night. The work will generally take place after 10 p.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays in an effort to affect the smallest number of customers.




Parade and Festival mark Cesar Chavez Day
