Submitted Questions and answers for Irvington and Antioch Public Art RFQs

General

Q. I am an art consultant. I am interested in putting together a team to respond to the Fremont BART Station RFP. Am I allowed to only submit one proposal with a lead artist, or may I collaborate with more than 1 team?

A. One person one app. If an artist wants to hire you subsequent to their successful application to help manage the project that would not be an issue, but as part of the team that is considered by the panel only one application.

<u>Irvington</u>

Q. Will Bay Area artists receive additional points in the scoring?

A. No. BART wants to make sure that Bay Area artists understand that while this is a national call, we greatly appreciate and hope that local artists who are qualified will consider applying.

Q. If I am an international artists, and I have team members in the U.S., are we qualified to apply?

A. No. All team members must reside in the U.S. with the right to work in the U.S. at the time of application. If an international team member is desired, the individual/team must apply without the information about the international person, and if they successfully win the commission, they are welcome to sub-contract as they wish, and is allowed by law.

Antioch

Q. Do all artists on the team need to be residents of California.

A. Yes. If applying as a team, all team members need to reside in California. If a California resident artist applies on their own and then decides to hire a sub-contractor to the project who is not a California resident, that would be permitted.
